

Editorial



EDUCATION FOR TRANSFORMATION

These past few weeks we have seen parents and young people who have passed their various examinations going from one Institution to the other looking for admissions. This evokes a question in me, “Why do parents want to send their children to our schools?” or “What is it that distinguishes our schools from the others?”

We could go back to history and recall the beginning of the Institute where Mother Mazzarello and the first Sisters lived the mandate, “I entrust them to you” and since then this same call is passed on to us the present generation. If young people flock to our Institutions then how much more we need to make our Institutions “A home”. We are reminded by GC 23 to *strike a balance between searching for a common good and attention to the good of the individual*. This personal attention would lead to transformation of an individual. Let us not forget that “Family Spirit” should be our hallmark in the educational process. Only when one feels welcomed and accepted that one grows into the best he or she can be. It requires a Listening attitude towards the young even to their unspoken words and unshed tears. Many of them feel a strong need for a home and for belonging. They are looking for meaning, for responsibility, for leadership and above all for ideals to pursue. Our educational process is fruitful only when knowledge brings about self-confidence and determination. For this reason the aim of education should be the transformation of the individual human being and he or she should take the central place in the whole process of education.

For Don Bosco, the mission to educate was the fundamental reason for his existence. His biography reveals him as a true educator even from early childhood. There were early beginnings that indicated clearly the extraordinary gifts, both of nature and of grace, which later developed into the worldwide activity now so well known to all. Don Bosco put all he had into the work of education; the physical gifts of his body, the power of his genius, his personal holiness. Also our saintly Mother Mazzarello dedicated herself wholeheartedly



in educating the others; right at her tender age as a member of the Sodality she engaged herself in teaching the young girls and women about God. Therefore it is an invitation for us Daughters of Mary Help of Christians to imbibe this true spirit of education from our Founders and give of our best in the practice of the Preventive System, which is a sure guide to educational fecundity. In this way we can prepare young people for an active involvement in the society thereby bringing transformation not only to the individual but also to the society at large.

QUALITIES OF A GOOD TEACHER

"The greatest danger for most of us is not that our aim is too high and we miss it, but that it is too low and we reach it." - Michelangelo

For anyone interested in becoming a teacher, it is important for them to enquire what qualities make a good teacher. A good teacher is characterized by numerous qualities which make it possible for them to do their job well. Without a doubt, every teacher comes with his/her own unique blend of such qualities, so as to educate, empower, ignite and rekindle the children and young people entrusted to their care. Every teacher is different, but every good teacher must possess the following qualities.



1. **An effective teacher loves the students.** For most people, this is a quality that is very much overlooked yet it is one of the very important qualities of a good teacher. Most teachers love teaching and even love the subjects they teach, but very few remember to even mention how much they love their students. It is extremely important to cherish great love and care about the students to bring out the best in them.
2. **An effective teacher loves to teach.** The single most important quality that every teacher should possess is a love and passion for teaching young people. Unfortunately, there are teachers with all academic degrees and carry on acquiring more, but do not have that passion to teach, who do not love what they do. Teachers who do not enjoy their job cannot possibly be effective. Those who love their teaching profession will teach with drive and passion, creativity and enthusiasm. Besides, kids are smarter than what we give them credit for. They will spot a fake sooner than anyone and thus destroys any credibility that the teacher may have.
3. **An effective teacher demonstrates a caring attitude.** Even teachers who love their job can struggle in this area, not because they don't care, but because they get caught up so much in the day to day routine of teaching that they can forget that

their students have lives outside of school. Getting to know a student on a personal level takes a lot of time and dedication. There is also a line that no teacher wants to cross where their relationship becomes too personal. Committed and caring teachers know how to balance this without crossing that line, and once a student believes the teacher truly cares for them, then there is no limit to what that student can achieve.

4. **An effective teacher can relate to his or her students.** The best teachers work hard to figure out how to relate to each of their students. Common interests can be hard to find, but exceptional teachers will find a way to connect with their students. For instance,

you may have a student who is a Lego fanatic. You can relate to that student if you do something as simple as ordering a Lego catalog and then going through it and discussing it with that student. Even if you have no actual interest in Lego's, the student will think you do and thus, naturally create a connection.

5. **An effective teacher is willing to think outside the box.** There is no one set pattern to teach. If we use a set of pattern it would be boring for both teachers and students. What makes teaching so exciting is that kids learn differently, and we have to find and utilize different strategies and differentiated learning to reach every student. What works for one student, will not work for every student. Teachers have to be willing to be creative and adaptive in their lessons. If you try to teach every concept, in the same manner, there will be students who miss out on key factors because they aren't wired to learn that way.
6. **An effective teacher is an excellent communicator.** To be the best possible teacher, you must be an effective communicator. However, in this area, you are not just limited

to being a skilled communicator to your students although that is a must. You must also be a strong communicator with parents of your students as well as your colleagues in the school. If you have a difficulty communicating with any of these three groups, then you limit your overall effectiveness as a teacher.

7. **An effective teacher is proactive rather than reactive.** This can be one of most difficult aspects for a teacher to conquer. Intense planning and organization can ultimately make your job less difficult. Teachers who plan ahead, looking for aspects that they might have issues with, and proactively looking for solutions to solve those problems will have less stress on them, than those teachers who wait until a problem arises and then tries to address it. No matter how well you plan, there will be surprises. However, being proactive can cut down on these surprises tremendously, thus making you more effective overall.

Regional Youth Meet at **AUXILIUM TURA**

The Youth Pastoral Team of the Province conducted a Regional Youth Meet at Auxilium Convent Tura, on 19-20 March 2016. The two-day program commenced at 10:00 a.m. on March 19, with the arrival and registration of the youth, which was followed by an inaugural function. 140 youth took part in the Meet. The Chief Guest of the day was Sr. Marcellina Sangma, the Provincial Bursar who also took up the first session after the opening ceremony.

Sr. Anita Dhar gave the second session on "Media and Youth". Sr. Manoda dealt on Group Dynamics and Sr. Monica Sangma on 'The significance of living the youthful phase with educated outlook'. First death anniversary of the 'Champion for Women's cause' Sr. Bernadette Sangma FMA

The first death anniversary of a special person with infectious personality Sr. Bernadette Sangma FMA was remembered with lot of emotions not only by her family and Province but also by all her friends round the globe on 27 April 2016. Tributes were paid to this 'champion for women's cause' while reminiscing her noble deeds done especially for women and children. The Holy Mass was offered at 3.00 pm in the beautiful FMA Cemetery Chapel at

Laitumkhrah, Shillong with Fr. Januarius Sangma SDB, her younger brother as the main celebrant and two other priests as concelebrants. Fr. Francis Cheeramben, during the homily spoke in honour of her spirit and of her memory, of her smile and her passion for life recalling also the prophetic role she played in the Church and the Society giving deeper awareness about the phenomenon of human trafficking, the work which she felt was not an option for the religious but

a necessity if we hope to make any kind of strategic commitment. After Mass, Fr. Uttam Malsom SDB blessed her beautifully festooned tomb. The presence of her 97-year-old father, Mr. George Marak who sat close to the tomb throughout the Rosary prayed around her tomb after Mass was not a sad spectacle but a sight to behold of the steadfast faith of the one who believed in the resurrection of the dead. Her tear-filled brothers and sisters surrounded him with care, attention and love giving him all comfort and consolation needed.

The congregation once again gathered at 6.30 pm in Auxilium, Nongthymmai, Provincial House to pray for her. The lay faithful, the Garo community of Shillong led the prayer for this noble soul, the one from their tribe who devoted her life helping the weakest and the most vulnerable from becoming human merchandise. A beautiful audio-visual presentation, the script for which was taken from the written tributes of the Sisters and her friends prepared by Sr. Wismary Kharbihkhiew brought once again fresh memories of this quiet dynamo who lived for others. Sr. Isabella Suja, the Provincial recollected her past association with Sr. Bernadette and reminisce the person she was, full of humility and nobility who with great wisdom did her 'Banking with God', depositing her life totally with Christ in full knowledge and trust.



Everyone was convinced that 'Humanity was her hallmark' and that it is LOVE that keeps her alive even after she's gone.

Notably, ahead of the first death anniversary, the Asian Movement of Women Religious Against Human Trafficking [AMRAT], during their Regional meeting held in Shillong paid glowing tributes to their mentor and guide for the role she played in the life and growth of AMRAT at the same time, invoking her help to reach out effectively to the needy and vulnerable women and girls. AMRAT is an organization whose formation was spearheaded by (Late) Sr. Bernadette Sangma inspired by the call given by the International Union of Major Superiors [UISG].

A Month with Mother Mazzarello

A month long study about the life and spirituality of St. Mary Mazzarello our Co-foundress was undertaken by the Novices of Bellefonte Shillong from 13 February - 19 March 2016. In this one-month course, the Novices were involved in the different group works, activities and spiritual animations. The special highlights of the study were the Exhibition and a Pilgrimage.

The study was divided into four stages, each characterized by a precise area of the maturation in Mother Mazzarello's Christian and consecrated life. The first stage 1837-1850, refers to the first thirteen years from her birth in Mornese. The second stage 1850 - 1860, is characterized by a marked

internalization of faith, a fruit of her first Holy Communion. The third stage 1860 -1872, we see her as a woman more open to God's plan in her life and finally the fourth and last stage: 12 years from the attack of typhoid to the foundation of the Institute. 1872 -1881 is characterized by the years of maturity, death and glorification.

One of the most excited moments was the preparation and the inauguration of the simple and meaningful two-day exhibition from 10-11 March. The Exhibition showcased the mini Mornese and Nizza Monferrato with the various symbols that are dear to the foundation of our Institute like the Mornese well, the Valponasca window, the Parish Church, the Collegio and the like. Crowning the whole month study was a devout pilgrimage taken on 18 March 2016 to the Church of St. Mary Mazzarello at Mawlyngad village, one of the Sunday oratories run by the Sisters of Auxilium Nongthymmai.

In humility we would say that our research and study about our Mother has broadened our knowledge and are exhorted to relive and to revive her virtues and her spirit.

The pilgrims then joyfully entered the Holy Door of the Cathedral. A half an hour Adoration to the Blessed Sacrament was animated by Fr. Julius Kurbah, the Assistant Parish Priest of Laitumkhrah,

which was followed by the Holy Eucharist, presided over by Rev. Fr. Augustine Koottala sdb. During the homily the pilgrims were reminded to be mediators of the mercy of God the Father and the Son in the Spirit to all our brothers and sisters.

We returned home with gratitude to God and the community for this opportunity and recommit ourselves to continue living the Holy Year with renewed faith and fervour.

Visit of Dr. Barry Bannister


their guidance and to the Sisters for their support. It was such a wonderful experience and it will surely lead us forward to help others in life.

7 Issues We Need To Talk About In Our Youth Groups!

Here are a few topics I believe we, as youth workers need to speak on in our ministries. I do believe that the increase in the statistics of these areas is largely due to social media. So as you read through think about how is social media affecting these areas and how can you affectively address them in your ministry. Notice that I don't give solutions, because I believe every youth group is different and you know your students better. I wrote this to hopefully open our eyes a bit to what could potentially be going on in our youth groups.

1. **Bullying:** (Source: stageoflife.com) – Bullying is still prevalent as it has always been, but with social media it has increased. Now students can be bullied 24 hours around the clock. 91% admit to being a victim of bullying.
2. **Texting and Social Media:** (Source: stageoflife.com) – 57% of teens credit their mobile device with improving their life. They also see it as key to their social life. The average teen spent 31 hours a week online which is like 5 hours a day

via a poll done in 2009. I can imagine that number has grown with the infusion of smart phones.

3. **Sex:** (Source: disease control center) – 47.4% of the students surveyed had sexual intercourse and out of the 47.4% that had sex 39.8% of those students did not use protection. 15.3% admitted to having sex with 4 or more people during their lifetime.
4. **Drugs and Alcohol:** (Source: SADD) – Statistically 72% of all students will have consumed alcohol by the end of high school. 37% have done so before the eighth grade. 6.7% of teens between the ages of 12-17 have smoked marijuana.
5. **Body Image:** (source: stageoflife.com) – More than 90% percent of all girls between the ages 15-17 want to change their appearance. Body weight is ranking the highest. 13% admit to having an eating disorder. 7 out of 10 girls believe they don't measure up or they're not good enough concerning their looks, performance in school and



relationships. 12% of teen boys are using unproven supplements and/or steroids to improve their body image. 44% of teens use skipping meals as a way to lose or control their weight.

- 6. **Depression:** Students are dealing with depression. From the severe to the not so severe, at any rate they are dealing with it. The NAMI (National Alliance of Mental Illness) states that 1 in 5 teens have experienced depression.
- 7. **The Future:** (Source: stageoflife.com) - 66% of teens are afraid of the future or life after graduation.

Now, I'm not a huge statistics type of person, but I do believe it paints somewhat of a picture for you and I to internalize into our own ministries. When I look at the numbers, I think, "how would these numbers fair in my ministry?"

Now, I know that there are more than 7 issues, and I also can tell you that these things are happening in my ministry. And if you were to take an honest look into your ministry you would probably say the same.

I hope there isn't anyone out there thinking that none of this is going on in their ministry.

Praying for students and telling them not to do something is not enough.

So the question is, what are some ways, with a Biblical perspective, that we can educate and open up dialogue about these topics with students and parents?

FORMATION OF FORMATORS of Salesian Co-operators

A national Programme on formation of Formators and Gender Equity Education was organized on 29 April - 1 May 2016 at the Don Bosco, Okhla where Salesian Co-operators from eight provinces (Hyderabad, Kolkata, Chennai, Trichy, Shillong, Guwahati, Bangalore and Delhi) participated for the three-day training program.

The first day was devoted to concepts of formation of a good Salesian Co-operator. The facilitators were Fr. Noel Maddhichetty, National Delegate of Salesian Family, and assisted by Mr. Anthuvan the World Councillor, Sr. Theresa Phawa National Delegate of the FMA and Mr. T.K Devasia, Formation in charge, elaborated on the Guidelines of formation of Salesian Cooperators. The Human, Christian and Salesian dimensions of the life of a Salesian co-operator were explained in terms of four Pillars, i.e., To Know, To Know to be, To Know to do and To Know to be in communion.

On the following two days the Salesian Cooperators engaged themselves on Gender Equity Education Training. Competent trainers Rahmath and Chandrakanta Bharati from Centre for Social Equity and Inclusion (CSEI), Delhi and Ajat Shatru, Karuna Dayal, and Noor Alam from Multiple Action Research Group (MARG) conducted the training program. The trainers, young in age and at heart, took great pains to explain to the Salesian Cooperators from across the country the concepts of Gender Equity, Gender Violence, and support systems available to promote Gender Equity.



The sessions were full of lively inputs supplemented by short films, power point presentations, action oriented discussions to bring about clear comprehension of concepts on Gender Equity and the need of Women Empowerment in our country through education of the young and the adults in various contexts.

The existing laws for protecting Women's Rights were explained indicating the practical steps to be taken in case of injustice. The whole programme was greatly enriched by the sharing of real life experiences by both participants and trainers. The various activities conducted by the trainers to bring out the current understanding of the participants, the myths and stereotypes also helped in bonding and better understanding of each other.

The Action Plans with timelines, drawn out by each province, marked the climax of the programme. The participants, with sentiments of gratitude appreciated the program organizers Fr. Noel Maddhichetty, the Delegate for Salesian Family, South Asia and Mr. Devasia the National Formation Coordinator of Salesian Cooperators and

others for making possible the training program, which was first of its kind in the region of South Asia. The participants drew up plan of action as per their respective provinces and pledged to take forward the follow up program in the provincial and local levels, both on formation of Salesian Cooperators and the gender equity education.

Salesian Family Launches training for Gender Equity Education in the North East

The Salesian Cooperators in collaboration with Salesian Family members organized a training of trainers programme on 'Gender Equity Education' from 14 to 15 May, 2016 at Don Bosco Technical School, Shillong. A team of resource persons headed by Rev. Fr. Noel Maddhichetty SDB, the national delegate for Salesian Family and Sr. Theresa Phawa the FMA National delegate Salesian

Family, conducted the training program. There were 48 participants representing the Salesian Co-operators, MSMHC, VSDB, FMA and SDB.

The first day began with a short prayer moment led by Sr. Theresa Phawa FMA. This was followed by a welcome speech of Fr. Philip Barjo SDB, the provincial delegate of the Salesian Family of Silchar Province. The introductory talk by Fr. Noel set a tone for the training program by highlighting the objectives and scope of the training program for the Salesian Family. He said that though laws on gender have not prevented increasing number of gender violations in our country. Education is the most powerful tool to change the mindset of the present and future generations of our nation. Salesian Family continuing the mission of Don Bosco with the young people and the powerful emphasis given by Pope Francis on the importance of family, in the new document "The joy of love", is launching the sixth Gender Education training program for the Salesian Family in Shillong.



In the first session Sr. Theresa Phawa presented the 'Concept and definition of Gender and Sex.' Karuna Dayal from Marg dealt on the topics of Gender roles, stereotypes and gender discrimination in the society. Mrs. Larisa Phawa an advocate from Shillong enlightened the participants on rights and laws, which address the gender violations. She focused the session on the rights and laws of women and other gender related issues. The session created much awareness on human and women's rights. Sonia Gotrop, Provincial Coordinator of Salesian Cooperators of Tezpur raised the concerns of gender violence. The day ended with the solemn celebration of the Holy Eucharist by Rev. Fr. George Malielkal SDB the provincial of Silchar province.

The second day being a Sunday, the celebration of the Holy Eucharist set a right note to begin the day on which the solemnity of Pentecost was presided over by Fr. Noel Maddhichetty. As the participants were mostly Salesian Cooperators, the two morning sessions were devoted to presentation of a new document, 'Formation Guidelines for Salesian Co-operators' by Fr. Noel and Sr. T. Phawa. The session on "Myths and facts on Gender" was elicited in lucid manner by Sara Koundinya from Delhi. The rest of the day the participants spent time in their specific groups to plan and implement Gender Equity Education program in their own lives, in their families and the work places. Each Group presented their action plan for the next six months indicating how they intend to impart this education to the young people in their own homes and work places. Sr. Theresa and Mr. Marius Kharkongor the Coordinator of Salesian Cooperators for the Northern region were the local organizers of the training Program. The two organizers were proposed and nominated as the contact persons for follow up this training program in region.

THE CHILD AND HIS MOTHER:


