EDITORIAL

EDUCATION IS A MATTER OF THE HEART

In the recent past we have witnessed much anxiety and concern as our nation eagerly waited for the declaration of Lok Sabha Election Result 2019. Subsequently, there is a growing sense of uncertainty and fear of what is to come. There were also celebrations at the good results of students in various examinations in and around the city. Celebration is not the end to success. The tougher part of life begins with the struggle to get into a prestigious Institution. With huge number of students passing out from many educational institutions and not being able to find an institution of his/her choice is a great challenge. This makes one think as to where do these young people go? How will they fulfil their aspired dreams? Are we not moved to do something more innovative in order to help such young people develop the potentialities and find meaning in life?

We are reminded of Don Bosco's comprehensive concept of education here. For him education entails helping the young person to develop and grow as an honest human being and a good Christian, so that he/she could find his/her proper place in society. Don Bosco stated clearly, "Education is a matter of the heart...". What sets Salesian education apart from other ways or systems of education is the fact that persons and relationships are of prime importance.

As Salesian educators, 'we show our love for the young in two ways: the Preventive System (relationships, the way we relate to young people) and the Oratory Model (experiences, those that we create for the young people). The Preventive System is based on the three keys: *Reason, Religion, and Loving Kindness*. From this basis, we see the relationships that Don Bosco encouraged: the



educator seeks to make oneself loved, takes the young where they are, believes in their capacity for good, wants to be with them.

We can learn from our traditional style of educating which is evident in the way Mary Domenica Mazzarello lived out her educative mission by her example. One of the most important educational criteria was, for her, the priority that is to be given to the person. She focuses on drawing young people to a personal and unique encounter with God. For her, to educate was the total giving of self in loving and joyful serenity.

In the light of our founders' educational project we can ask ourselves if our educational institutions today are merely result oriented? Or are we concern about offering young people hope and future? The present situation of our youth today triggers us to seek out ways and possibilities in order to gradually help them acquire inner certainty and autonomy.

It is the right time for us to re-awaken the original freshness of the Institute by allowing ourselves to be guided by Mary for a regeneration in the Holy Spirit, to make our educating communities generate new life as we have begun the journey towards GCXXIV. May she make us attentive and sensitive to the cry for help of poor young people who are entrusted to our care today!

MY EXPERIENCE IN THE EVANGELIZING MISSION

It was in the year 2015, the seventeenth Lyear of my religious life that I was sent to St. Peter's Convent Pyndengrei for the mission of direct evangelization. Prior to this I served as boarding Assistant, in charge of the primary school, the workroom and the kitchen in the various communities of our Province. Being a first time experience for me in the field of evangelization, I had no idea how to go about particularly in meeting and relating with people. Initially, I visited families in Pyndengrei itself and came to know Catholic women who gave me some ideas to go about and they took me to families that needed our attention; to visit the sick and those who do not practice the faith. Gradually by attending the prayer meetings and other programmes of the Parish I have come to know the people better. In the first year itself I was able to reach out to 350 families. It is noteworthy to mention here that St. Peter's Parish, Pyndengrei consists of seven villages numbering around three hundred Catholic families and while Pyndengrei itself consists of around 600 Catholic families.

Some activities that I undertake in the Parish are conducting Children's Retreat in each village during the winter vacation of the students that is in the month of December till February. During this time children are taught the daily Prayers, Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, the Catholic faith, the Ten Commandments and the Precepts of the Church. Seminars on various topics like Christian faith, Christian Families, Role



of the parents in the Family, Prayer Life are being conducted from time to time as an annual programme for the various villages of the Parish. Preparation for the Sacraments of Baptism and Marriage preparation three times a year and preparation for First Communion and Confirmation once a year. I do join in the pilgrimages to other Parishes and villages along with the youth or women, whoever is conducting the same. They do appreciate my presence and always invite me for their various initiatives that we plan together. I associated myself with the Small Christian Communities (SCC) and the Prayer Group of the Parish. With them I animate them and take part in their meetings and programmes.

In the capacity of youth animator of the Parish some significant programmes in collaboration with the them are the monthly Touring Programme, conducting the Way of the Cross during Lenten season in various families who are less fervent, visiting and rendering some material help to the needy families. To reawaken the faith and Christian responsibility of some young people who do not care much about their spiritual life, the youth as a group conducts prayer meeting and counsels them. Once in two months we have recollection for them and seminar or retreat once a year.

Along with the Catholic Women Association I join them in their activities like visiting the orphanages, Old Aged homes, visiting, praying and giving some financial help to the sick and elderly members of the association. Being the spiritual advisor of the Catholic Women Association I have ample opportunities in giving my services to them in the form of spiritual guidance, encouragement and giving them ideas to go about with their activities. I would like to share an initiative taken up by the Catholic Women Association at Pyndengrei namely supporting the thirteen orphans of a family. The women from each block of the Association support them with material help such as foodstuffs and other grocery items.

At times, I do offer personal counseling to the youth particularly those who are





addicted to drugs. The five of them whom I have been able to give guidance have turned a new leaf in their life. One of them has stopped this bad habit and continued his studies; another one having given up this habit has turned out to be the President of the youth association, the third one has been able to settle his life with his wife, while another one has got a job outside the state and the other one has been sober in his ways and is staying with the family.

I find fulfillment in my service to lead souls to Jesus though I am just an unworthy instrument. There are many challenges that I encounter in the fulfillment of this mission but in spite of that I find happiness in it. In whatever I do I could truly feel God's presence and guidance in every step I take. In all these, I owe my inspiration from the Word of God, Church Documents, Bible Commentaries and other Church related materials. "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden" (Mt. 5:14) is the verse that inspires me at all times in my personal life and mission. I am very happy in this work of evangelization that the Province has entrusted me with. I invite you all my dear Sisters to be generous in sharing Jesus with all whom we meet in our life's journey.

Opportunities (Continuation)

"For all ways and by all means"

Proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus is a service that we can offer to the ecclesial community and to humanity. St. Paul says: "Woe to me if I do not proclaim the Gospel..." (1 Cor. 9:16) This passion for proclamation should be in the hearts of all pastoral workers. But today there are also other ways and means of announcing Christ: the press, television, radio, cinema and the Internet.

The Church must become aware of how important it is to make best use of these roads and enter to these spaces. Paul VI in the first Message for the World Communications Day emphasized that the Church intends "to draw the attention of her children and of all men of good will to the vast and complex phenomenon of modern means of social communication, such as the press, motion pictures, radio and television, which are one of the most characteristic notes of modern civilization". The Church by its very nature is communication and the communication of God to man who brings good news to all, consequently cannot be content merely with the announcement to the neighbours but must try to reach to everyone.

The Encyclical *Redemptoris Missio* of John Paul II, at n. 37 speaks of the *first*

Areopagus of the modern age, which is "a global village", where "With the advent of computer telecommunications and what are known as computer participation systems, the Church is offered further means for fulfilling her mission. Methods of facilitating communication and dialogue among her members can strengthen the bonds of unity between them. Immediate access to information makes it possible for her to deepen her dialogue with the contemporary world". In this way, the Pope confirms that "Communicating Jesus Christ: Way, Truth and Life" is now indispensable, if the Church wants to meditate, act and communicate the Good News of Salvation in Jesus Christ. With the Message of 2000, the year of the Great Jubilee, John Paul II draws attention to the change that has taken place in society: Already the media contribute to spiritual enrichment in many ways - for example, the many special programmes being carried to worldwide audiences through satellite telecasts during the year of the Great Jubilee. In other cases, however, they display the indifference, even hostility, to Christ and his message that exist in certain sectors of secular culture. Communication is a "system" that envelops us: it is necessary, therefore, to learn to communicate with all the voices, by all means, so that the message of the Church translated into an active and creative way, can be heard and understood by all men and women of our

time. We Christian communicators should not be afraid to open the doors of social communications to Christ, so that the Good News of the Gospel can be heard from the roofs of the world. In the Message for the World Communications Day 2010, Pope Benedict, speaking on the task of priests to announce Christ writes: Using new communication technologies, priests can introduce people to the life of the Church and help our contemporaries to discover the face of Christ. Pope Francis in these years of his pontificate, thanked for the service of the media, through which the Church can open its doors to the digital environment to bring the Gospel message "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1: 8). In particular, he stresses that "the Church's attention and presence in the world of communication is important, in order to dialogue with the people of today and bring it to an encounter with Christ: a Church that accompanies the journey, knows how to set out with all. In this context the revolution of the media and information is a great and exciting challenge, which requires fresh energy and a "new imagination to transmit to others the beauty of God". To communicate the beauty of God today, as in the past, the family is the central communicative place. Pope Francis believes that Family is an environment in which we learn to communicate in an experience of closeness, a setting where communication takes place, a "communicating community". From the womb of the family comes the first announcement that parents give to their children, so the family must know how to communicate.

Communication is first of all a Relationship

Communication is the most important means to build up good relationships. It allows people to share one's interests with everyone for the betterment of the community. All the Popes, in the Messages for the World Communications Day, have greatly emphasized the value of the relationship between people, with the environment, in the countries and in the Church. Unfortunately, today many communications have problems with relationships.

Paul VI invites us to thank God because from the beginning of the world He established an inseparable relationship with man and gave him the intelligence to cultivate communication with Him and with others as well. He affirms that: The Church looks with favour on the growth of man's productive capacity, and also on the ever widening network of relationships and exchanges between persons and social groups; they are for her a reason, a sign and an anticipation of an ever greater brotherhood, and from this point of view she encourages advertising, which can become a wholesome and efficacious instrument for reciprocal help among *men*. In the pontificate of John Paul II, the discourse on communication emerges strongly not only in relation to mass media and information technology, but above all in relation to human communication that opens up in the existential relationship.

Social Communication also becomes an instrument to support relationship between faith and culture. John Paul II says: At the beginning of communication there is a man-communicator and, at its end, there is a man-receiver, the media of social communication will facilitate the encounter between faith and culture so that a mass of isolated individuals will not be formed, each one of whom may be in dialogue with the written page, or the stage, or the small or large screen, but a community of persons aware of the

importance of the meeting with faith and with culture and determined to achieve it through personal contact, in the family, in the place of employment, in social relations. The Message of 1995, the year in which the centenary of cinema was celebrated, noted how this language is a means of transportation of culture and has been able to create communities, as the parishes, oratories opened the first "community halls" where people found themselves in order to spend a fun and leisure time together. Year after year, the development of technologies creates new relationships, new environments and new cultures. Benedict XVI aware of a society that is organizing itself and centering more and more around the communication on the Net, in his Message of 2009 chooses, almost surprisingly, a theme concerning the relationship between new technologies and the relationships that are being built and states: The desire for connectedness and the instinct for communication that are so obvious in contemporary culture are best understood as modern manifestations of the basic and enduring propensity of humans to reach beyond themselves and to seek communion with others.

New technologies are changing both communication patterns and human relationships and these changes mainly involve the younger generation growing up in a digital society. Always Benedict XVI, addresses the young people of the "digital continent" and invites them to be responsible and to promote a culture of respect, dialogue and friendship, encouraging them to use social spaces. In the Message of 2013, he writes about the need to build and strengthen online relationship, the place that is now part of the daily experience of many people, especially young people. For this reason

we need to be attentive to the birth and popularity of social networks, which favor dialogical and interactive forms of communication and relationship. online observes, however, that He communication often lacks true dialogue. Pope Francis emphasizes: The digital world can be an environment rich in humanity; a network not of wires but of people. The impartiality of media is merely an appearance; only those who go out of themselves in their communication can become a true point of reference for others. Personal engagement is the basis of the trustworthiness of a communicator. Christian witness, thanks to the internet, can thereby reach the peripheries of human existence.

Meeting people, especially the young, where they are

In communication, young people could express their ability to relate with their peers and encounter with other group of people: this requires mutual respect, the commitment to learn from each other and the ability to dialogue. The authentic and respectful encounter reaches the needs of the people to help them understand the meaning of their life, their vocation and the problems of the world. By inserting oneself into everyone's daily life, the media offers the possibility not only of informing oneself but also of growing in the ability to communicate.


John Paul II speaks of the encounter and emphasizes, first and foremost on the value of the encounter between faith and culture, which encourages the meeting of people among them. This encouraged the means of social communication to represent a precious gush of "cultural enrichment for the individual and for the whole family". The media, for example,

make it possible to participate in religious events that take place in distant places, satisfy an interest and bring special comfort to the sick and the oppressed. They contribute in promoting awareness of the universal Church of being a family and its attentiveness to the problems of all peoples. The media can really help to bring people's hearts closer to God with sympathy, understanding and fraternity, but sometimes they seem to impose themselves as ends and not as mere means. The Pope continues by saying that the power of the media can foster the spiritual life of the Church in many ways, because the media also arrive where people cannot always reach. Therefore, we are called to rediscover the value of the personal encounter and the beauty of everything that underlies our life; above all, the encounter with Christ, who is the source of all the other encounter, even those that occur thanks to mediated communication. Pope Benedict, his Message of 2009 emphasizes that reflecting on the significance of new technologies, it is important to consider not only their undoubted capacity to promote contact between people but also the quality of the contents they are called to put into movement.

The Pope speaks of the culture of respect, of dialogue, of friendship, of the encounter in which pastoral workers and educators have the task of paving the way for new encounters. This implies taking care of the quality of human contact, paying attention to men and women, especially to young people and their true spiritual needs. Benedict XVI writes, "The new technologies allow people to meet each other beyond the confines of space and of their own culture, creating in this way an entirely new world of potential

friendships". This happens above all in the lives of young people in particular who are experiencing this change in communication, with all the anxieties, challenges and creativity typical of those open with enthusiasm and curiosity to new experiences in life. Their ever greater involvement in the public digital forum, created by the so-called social networks, helps to establish new forms of interpersonal relations, influences selfawareness and therefore inevitably poses questions not only of how to act properly, but also about the authenticity of one's own being. Pope Francis also clearly underlines that the digital network can be a place rich in humanity. A network, therefore, not for occasional meetings but for real encounter with the person, because today, we run the risk that some media will condition us so much that we may ignore our real neighbour. It is in the 2015 Message that Pope Francis speaks of Mary's meeting with her cousin Elizabeth to demonstrate what communication really is: discovery and construction of proximity. Furthermore, Pope Francis in his message for this year 2019 exhorted, "We need to recognize how social networks, on the one hand, help us to better connect, rediscover, and assist one another, but on the other, lend themselves to the manipulation of personal data, aimed at obtaining political or economic advantages, without due respect for the person and his or her rights". It is an invitation to all of us to make good use of these wonderful instruments. Let us be masters to them but not slaves.

Transmission of the Guidelines for the Formation Period of Temporary Vows

The Province was blessed with the presence of Sr. Maria Nieves Reboso, General Councillor for Formation and the Sisters of the Team; Sr. Maria Fisichella and Sr. Anelfreda Miranda from 8 to 18 April 2019. The purpose of the visit was the transmission of the Guidelines for the Formation Period of Temporary Vows; a result of the work done by the Formation Sector, the International Commission, the Formators and particularly the Temporary Professed Sisters from all over the world.

On their arrival in Shillong Sr. Maria Nieves Reboso, General Councillor for Formation, Sr. Maria Fisichella and Sr. Anelfreda Miranda of the Formation Team were accorded a warm welcome with a traditional attire called *Risha* a small shawl of the state of Tripura, a necklace called *paila* of the state of Meghalaya and a bouquet of flowers. Further the Novices presented a fusion dance of different tribes and a welcome song.

The animation programme organized for different groups centered on the theme "Do whatever He tells you" with an iconic representation of the wedding feast at Cana. The first group was for the Community Animators and Formators from 9 - 12 April 2019 at FMA Outreach, Shillong numbering thirty-five in all. During the encounter the Sisters were presented the entire guidelines with ten sessions of group work. The Sisters appreciated the great love and care the Institute takes in the formation of its members. The community animators resolved to own up responsibility in making the document known to the other members of the community and to live up to the principles envisaged by it in the living out of the Salesian charism.

The thirty-eight Aspirants and Postulants too had a share of the input sessions and group work from the Formation team on 13 April 2019 at Auxilium Training Centre, Saiden. The young candidates took interest in whatever was offered to them and expressed that they were proud to belong to the FMA family.



The following days namely 14 -15 April saw a gathering of 68 (sixty-eight) Temporary Professed Sisters for a two-day animation programme at FMA Outreach, Shillong. The young Sisters were very enthusiastic and felt loved by the Institute for such a wonderful and meticulous book of guidelines offered specifically for the period of Formation of the Temporary Vows. In all the sessions and group sharing the young Sisters were open and frank in their intervention. They took upon themselves to live up to the expectation of the Institute and give of their best in the various communities they are called to serve.

On 16 April a day of animation programme was organized for the 41 (forty-one) Novices at the Immaculate Heart Novitiate, Bellefonte – Shillong. The Novices were thrilled to have such a unique opportunity in interacting directly with the General Councillor for Formation and the team. While being challenged by the lifestyle of the modern world they expressed confidence that with the guidance of the Superiors and their personal commitment to auto-formation they would be able to mould themselves and be for the young, helpers like Mary, the Help of Christians.

Sr. Nieves and team were fortunate to visit the other communities of Shillong namely the Provincial House – Auxilium



Nongthymmai and Sacred Heart Convent, Mawlai on 17 April. Here too Sr. Nieves met the Sisters in groups and inspired in them to live their commitment to the full. She particularly pointed out that the Sisters both young and old need each other to complement one another in the fulfillment of the mission of the community. The young people too in both the houses were equally excited and filled with enthusiasm to behold a representative of Mother General. Apart from this, the Formation Team visited the FMA Cemetery at the Catholic Cemetery of the Cathedral Parish and prayed for the departed Sisters of the Province. They also made a short visit to the Salesian Provincial House at Mawlai; Fr. Joseph Puthenpurakal who welcomed them to the house termed the visit as "Sisters meeting their Brothers in the spirit of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello".

In the evening of 17 April the nearby communities of Shillong gathered at Bellefonte for a thanksgiving ceremony which included prayer moments and gestures of gratitude through various items like dances, songs and speeches. The last day of the visit the 18 April was spent in meeting the Sisters of Bellefonte Community, the Mistress of Novices along with the two Assistants and preparations for the departure.

The ten-day visit of Sr. Nieves and Team to the Province surely brought blessings and revival of the Salesian spirit, which all the Sisters and Candidates hope to live by and strive to be committed Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. It was truly a wedding feast experience with a unique quality and sentiments. The wedding feast is not ended but it had just started and would be lived out in every community of the Province.

n 24 to 25 April 2019 Sr. Merilyn Wahlang, Social Development Coordinator organized two-day a training programme at Auxilium Convent Umdang on the theme "Young Women Entrepreneurial and Development Programme" supported by FMA National Development Forum (NDF). The invited guest of the day was the General Manager of District Commerce and Industries Centre West Khasi Hills District, Mr. Umesh Muktieh and the resource person was Mr. Phrisan Nongmin. 35 persons most of whom are farmers and daily wage earners from the different villages participated in the programme.

With a view to empower the women on skills and income generation trainings, the day focused on basket making and broom making. The participants showed great sign of interest and worked very hard to complete the set tasks. The training aimed at enabling the young women discover their talents and make the best use of the resources available along with



the networking idea from the District Industries Office. Mr. Muktieh enlightened the participants on the importance of Handicraft and the market value of bamboo in the country as well as outside the country. He also assured to send some experts to train them and to link them with the Industry when their art will be up to the mark. At the closing ceremony, Mr. Raisen Mawsor the Headman of the village encouraged the participants to work hard and even set a market in the village itself. Sr. Merilyn interviewed few participants who said that the programme had been of great help to them and that it will definitely become a source to generate income for them.

FMA - PCI Social Communications Seminar

Communications Social Seminar for the Provincial Conference of India (FMA-PCI) was held from 3 - 8 May 2019 at Mazzarello Youth Centre, Wadala - Mumbai. The resource persons were Sr. Maria Helena Moreira, General Councillor for Social Communication and Sr. Gabriella Imperatore from Rome. 28 participants from the seven Indian provinces took part in the same. Sr. Euginia Laloo, Sr. Teresa Kamsuan, Sr. Rodalin Kamar and Sr. Sandra Diengdoh represented the Province. The theme that guided the Encounter was "The Communication Plan in the Educommunication Mission of the FMA".

Through input sessions, discussions, group work, individual study the participants were helped to deepen on the main topics like Educommunicative Processes, Educommunicative Ecosystems



and Educommunicative Management. Another significant presentation dealt with was the Visual Communication Manual of the FMA and the importance of legibility and juridical registration of the Logo of the Institute, which would be used by all the Provinces and the various sectors of the Institute. While speaking on the Educommunicative Management, the resource persons emphasized that the coordinators of social communication are not merely managers of things but of people. The DMA Magazine of the Institute (1952-2019) was elaborately presented by Sr. Gabriella Imperatore and exhorted the Sisters to make the best use of it. The group also worked out on the Profile of the Coordinator for Social Communication taking into consideration the following elements: Characteristics, Communication skills, Professional skills, Functions and Tasks, and Communication Strategies. Apart from this, the group was



also taken for an exposure visit to St. Paul's Institute of Communication Education (SPICE) Bandra Mumbai and Tej Prasarini Don Bosco Communications, Matunga – Mumbai. They also visited the nearby FMA communities in Bandra and Wadala. The Sisters of the different provinces displayed their respective cultures either in song, dance or an audio-visual presentation during the Cultural evening. Each province took turns to animate the prayer moments, recreation and the other highlights of the day.




as a remembrance of this beautiful day. It was indeed a pleasant experience and the day was successful with the co-operation of the three centres.


Know Your Gadgets - LAPTOP

The most important thing to consider when looking for the best laptop you can buy is that you think about what you're going to need that laptop to do. It's rarely ever a case of one size fits all. Some users need something lighter and more portable. Other users need discrete graphics for things like video editing or running high end games. There's a wide variety of sizes, features and prices, which makes choosing the best laptop a challenge.

Most laptops come with one of three operating systems: Windows, Apple (MacBooks) and Chrome OS. Choosing the right one is a personal preference, but here's a quick summary of what each offers.

WINDOWS

The most flexible operating system, Windows appears on many more makes and models than Chrome OS or Mac OS X. Windows notebooks offer a wide array of features





from touch screens to fingerprint readers to dual graphics chips. Windows 10, the latest version of Microsoft's flagship operating system, provides a number of improvements over Windows 7 and 8, including the ability to switch between tablet and desktop modes, a revamped Start menu with live tiles and the powerful Cortana digital assistant.

APPLE MACOS HIGH SIERRA

All MacBooks come with Apple's latest desktop operating system, mac OS Mojave. Overall, the operating system offers similar functionality to Windows 10, but with a different take on the interface that substitutes an apps dock at the bottom of the screen for Microsoft's Start menu and taskbar. Instead of the Cortana digital

assistant, Mac users get Siri. They can also perform transactions with Apple Pay, take calls or texts from their phones and unlock their laptops with an Apple Watch.



CHROME OS

Found on inexpensive Chromebooks such as the Samsung Chromebook 3. Google's OS is simple and secure, but more limited than Windows or macOS.



Here are Some of the Main Components to Keep an Eye on.

- ➤ *CPU*: The "brain" of your computer, the processor has a huge influence on performance, but depending on what you want to do, even the least-expensive model may be good enough. Here's a rundown.
- *Intel Core i5*: If you're looking for a mainstream laptop with the best combination of price and performance, Core i5 CPU is the best. Models that end in U (ex: Core i5-7200U) are the most common. Those with the a Y in the name are low power and have worse performance while models with an HQ use more wattage and appear in thicker gaming and workstation systems. Intel's new 8th Generation, CPUs have model numbers that begin with 8 (ex: Core i5-8250U) and double the number of cores from two to four, which dramatically improves performance.
- ❖ Intel Core i9: Supplanting the Core i7 as the new top-of-the-line CPU from Intel, Core i9 processors provide faster performance than any other mobile chip. Available only on premium laptops, workstations and high-end

- gaming rigs, Core i9 CPUs are only worth their premium price if you're a power user who uses the most demanding programs and apps.
- ❖ Intel Core i7: A step up from Core i5, which Models with numbers that end in HQ or K use higher wattage and have four cores, allowing for even faster gaming and productivity. There are also Core i7 Y series chips that have lower power and performance. Keep an eye out for CPUs that have a 8 in the model number (ex: Core i7-8250U) because they are part of Intel's latest, 8th Generation Core Series, and offer better performance. Note that Intel's 9th Generation CPUs are coming to laptops later in 2019.
- ❖ *Intel Core i3*: Core i3 are generally found in entry-level systems, performance is just a step below Core i5 and so is the price.
- * AMD Ryzen Mobile: A new set of chips that are designed to compete with Intel Core i5 and Core i7. Ryzen Mobile CPUs tend to be paired with AMD's own Vega graphics chipsets, which are currently far better for gaming than Intel's own onboard graphics.










- AMD A, FX or E Series: Found on low-cost laptops, AMD's processors -- the company calls them APUs rather than CPUs -- provide decent performance for the money that's good enough for web surfing, media viewing and productivity.
- Intel Pentium / Celeron: These chips offer the slowest performance, but can do if your main tasks are web surfing and light document editing.
- Intel Core m / Core i5 / i7 "Y Series" --Low-power and low heat allow systems with these processors to go fan less. Performance is better than Celeron, but a notch below regular Core i5 U series.
- Intel Xeon: Extremely powerful and expensive processors for large mobile workstations. If you do professionalgrade engineering, 3D modelling or video editing, you might want a Xeon, but you won't get good battery life or a light laptop.
- ➤ RAM: More RAM allows for more applications to be run at the same time, and for more data to be quickly accessible by the system at any one time, which comes in handy for tasks such as editing photos or video content. Some laptops come with 4GB of RAM, 8GB or more.
- > Storage Drive: There are two general types of storage drive that use in Laptop or PC: Hard Disk Drives (HDD) and Solid-State Drives (SSD) which comes in 250GB, 500GB, 1TB or more. Solid state drive (SSD) is at least three times the speed and a much faster than a Hard Disk Drive.
- ➤ **Display:** The more pixels you have, the more content you can fit onscreen, and the sharper it will look.



Unfortunately, some laptops have 1366×768 displays and so do some business laptops, but if one can afford it, paying extra for a panel that runs at 1920×1080 , also known as full HD or 1080p is recommended . Higher-end laptops have screens that are 2560×1600 , 3200×1800 or even 3840×2160 , which all look sharp but consume more power, lowering your battery life.

Graphics Chip: If you're not playing PC games, creating 3D objects or doing high-res video editing, an integrated graphics chip (one that shares system memory) will be fine. If you have any of the above needs, a discrete graphics processor from AMD or Nvidia is essential. As with CPUs, there are both high- and lowend graphics chips. Low-end gaming or workstation systems today usually have Nvidia GTX 1050 while midrange models have GTX 1050 Ti or GTX 1060 and high-end models have RTX 2070 or 2080. Nvidia maintains a list of its graphics chips from low to high end, as does AMD.

Overall, you need to balance these features with your budget and your needs, and you might have to make some compromises. Rarely does a laptop come along, that ticks all the boxes especially when it comes to price.

Then the donkey started to play the same trick every day.


The salt seller came to understand the trick and decided to teach a lesson to it. The next day he loaded a cotton bag on the donkey.



Introduction To New Activities


