

A TESTIMONY OF GOD'S UNFAILING ACCOMPANIMENT

As a child I had the joy of the presence of the Sisters or Fathers who usually visit our village at Umyiap Mawkynbat and would always stay in our house. Through these visits the love of God was infused in us little children even with a simple gesture of treasuring the holy pictures distributed by them. Later on when I was admitted at St. Peter's Convent Pyndengrei I encountered the Sisters in close quarters. I was so inspired by the life of Late Sr. Agnes Kurkalang and Late Sr. Felicita Syngngoh who visited the villages those times in the late 70s in the Parish of Nongstoiñ. At that time the Parish of Nongstoiñ consisted of the whole of West Khasi Hills. Looking at them, deep within my heart I too wanted to be like them.

It was a practice at that time that the senior girls from the boarding would go to the different villages and conduct the Oratories on Sundays. Though I was younger but somehow I too was given the chance to accompany these girls where I had the opportunity to guide the prayers and hymns at Mass without a Priest. So



these experiences deepen in me the thirst for evangelization. At times, I used to accompany the Sisters for village touring during holiday time. I have witnessed their hard work and their thirst for souls even walking long distances with no conveniences for basic needs but what was most striking was that they always had a joyful face and was contented to mingle with the poor people around.

"From far, you look like a Sister", these were the words from Sr. Isabella Wahlang to me which I thought paved the way for me in pursuing my vocation as an FMA. At that time I was reading in Class VIII.

In my twenty-seven years of religious life I spent the most of these years in the touring ministry. I had the privilege of working in Umswai for three





years, Rambrai for ten years, Mawkyndeng for three years and presently running six years in Rangblang. I am truly grateful to the Superiors who gave me this opportunity of sharing in the evangelizing mission of the Church. When in the village I made it a point to visit every Catholic family particularly in the mornings and evenings. The daytime would be spent in visiting the sick and the elderly in the village, at times we would teach children prayers and songs or journeying to the next village on foot normally accompanied by a Head Catechist. This was mainly done in the earlier times and would spend almost a week or more in a village. Nowadays, with an easier access to the villages since many Parishes have come up and the children are not in the villages during the daytime because they go to school, a winter programme like retreat for children, preparation for sacraments and catechism classes are conducted for them. In many occasions I help in guiding the faithful for Church services and give talks and instructions to the faith. Encountering villages where disunity prevails was another important and challenging mission, which many times with continuous help they come over and a priest is called for the sacrament of reconciliation and Eucharist.

I can testify that at different times God continually inspires me in my mission and

have made use of many means in order to share the Word of God to the people. I would like to share an effective means, which I personally experience during family visits. I have made a collection of Bible quotations for all occasions: some consoling words, some for admonishing wrong ways, words of blessings, on forgiveness, mercy, encouraging words and so on. These I have typed and stuck on a hard paper and stored in a small box; we could call it Word-power Box. I have witnessed that many families were helped according to their own needs; some families have turned over their life after such experiences. What inspired me to do this is the openness to God's grace which when my words fail the Lord has every word for all situations. At an instance, there was a village that harboured misunderstandings and disunity but this initiative of praying with the Word of God was a powerful means of making them understand the situation they were in and soon they have come to terms with each other. Another significant experience on receiving such messages from the Word of God was that we witnessed the withdrawal of persons who had an evil intention on the others. Many times without knowing the family background or the difficulties of the family but in prayer using the Word of God, which the member of the





family picked up, from the box, they start revealing their problems and difficulties or at times even their bad habits. This has brought consolation to the families and to some it has helped them to repent and start anew. In all these, I have realized the importance of being in the grace of God and therefore I make it a point to receive the sacrament of reconciliation often and also participate in the prayer convention at the Holy Redeemer Renewal Centre, Mawkhlam Parish. Usually whenever I go to the Centre, I always go with a group of faithful and we could see that they have received the taste for prayer and the Word of God. Not only this but the faithful have expressed a desire of starting a prayer group in which I have helped the group to come together once a week and animate them. Even if only a few turned up we are not discouraged but continue doing the same. As of now it's been almost two years of this initiative and is slowly gaining momentum and more people have joined and understood the value of being close to God in prayer and worship.

In my mission of evangelization I have powerfully experienced the presence of God who gives me the strength and inspires me at every moment according to the needs of the time. I also thank God for the good health He gives me which never prevented me from exercising my touring ministry. He preserved me from many dangers and I can really say that even my family is blessed abundantly and they too have not disturbed me in fulfilling the mission the

Lord has given me. I truly acknowledge the unfailing support of the community members who take interest in the mission and would always assure me their prayers. It gives me great joy when I am able to be with the people, teach them and help in the various programmes of the Parish. Most importantly through family visits, when it looks like they were not receptive to the visit but later on they have turned a new leaf and start living better lives.

Even in carrying out my mission not everyone is for us. At times I hear sarcastic remarks, people resent from visiting their family or they are not even willing to allow their house to be blessed but in all these at the end of the day they turned out to be blessings when people have understood and changed their ways.

My humble sharing with you my Sisters who are directly in the mission of evangelization is that we should not worry of what to do or what to say as Jesus himself has said, at the right time He is the one who will inspire and guide us in this mission. The only requisite is to be happy and joyful in sharing this work of spreading the Gospel values. God is the one who will strengthen us when we do not know what to say or do, provided we are open to him in prayer and life of grace. I am personally convinced that if I do not have the grace of God within me I feel handicapped and all what I do is fruitless.

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing" from the Gospel of St. John 15: 5 is the Bible verse that strengthens me in my mission. I strongly desire as much as my health permits me to continue in this mission and wish many others to join in this particular mission, which is so unique and dear to our Province.

THE WORLD COMMUNICATION DAY

Opportunity and Challenges faced

by the Church Today •~~

ommunication has now become part and parcel of one's activity and has a great impact in our life and the society. The rapidity with which technologies, devices, applications and digital environments are developed also challenge the Church, engaged in proclamation, evangelization and witness to the love of God for every man and woman of every time and place. The Church has always been questioned and it has been almost challenged by the launching of every new technique and technology. It has always tried to grasp the true meaning of communication and the positive aspects for its mission and at the same time the Christian communities recall the limits and risks in the use of the media.

Convinced that these means can help and facilitate evangelization, we can ask ourselves in this society of communication, what are the opportunities and challenges that the Church must face so that the Good News of the Gospel can be permeated to the ends of the earth and thus become the soul of the modern era.

Messages for the World Communications Day

Pope Paul VI, responding to a request from Inter Mirifica, starting from 1967, mentioned that "the World Communications Day" is to be celebrated annually around a theme. Therefore, every year, the Pontiffs choose a theme and write a Message, addressed to the media and communication operators and to the

whole Christian community in its different components. Over the long period of time, the matters highlighted the need for adequate communication on crucial issues such as the family, the young, the elderly, peace and justice, human freedom, the proclamation of faith, the evangelization, the relationship between faith and culture, reconciliation, the media as an instrument of dialogue, unity, peace and development among peoples.

The Messages of the Pontiffs that have followed one another in these decades are Paul VI (1967-1978), John Paul II (1979-2005), Benedict XVI (2006-2013) and Francis (2014-2019).

Through the contents of the Messages, it is possible to take hold of in a diachronic way, the development and influence of the media and in a synchronic manner, the critical confrontation and open dialogue that the Church invited to undertake and deepen with the culture in order to make it present, but above all to make the announcement of the Gospel of Jesus authentic and effective.

The first message of PaulVI in 1967 opens with a breath of hope and aimed at the good of the human family: The Church, which is truly and intimately linked with humankind and its history intends "to draw the attention of her children and of all men of good will to the vast and complex phenomenon of the modern means of social communication, such as the press, motion pictures, radio

and television, which form one of the most characteristic notes of modern civilization"

The themes of his Messages starting from 1967 to 1978 reveal of his being attentive to the evolution of culture and society and also to the increase of mass media. Paul VI offers to Christians and to every people of good will, a clear, deep and pastoral reflection for a wise and effective use of the modern instruments. He considers the media as "marvelous techniques" through which "man's social life has taken on a new dimension: time and space have been conquered, and man has become as it were a citizen of the world, sharing in and witnessing the most remote events and the vicissitudes of the whole human race".

His teaching regarding communication is deeply rooted in his Magisterium. The Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelium Nuntiandi* of 8 December 1975, at the conclusion of the Synod of Bishops on Evangelization in the Modern World, dedicates Chapter IV to the ways, the methods and means of evangelization, including the media. Paul VI addressed the Church by saying that *he would feel guilty before his Lord if he did not use these powerful means*. It is a call to all pastoral agents to give answers, to become competent and be aware of this necessary duty.

John Paul II was a great communicator with words and gestures. His pontificate spans two millennia. The passage of his pontificate is not only chronological but also cultural. He began over the years that saw the development and dissemination of mass media and he concluded it at the time of online communication, with the Internet now widespread. Those years were characterized by many significant events also in terms of organization of ecclesial Communities that surrounded the realities of the mass media. In 1981 the Local Free Radio television Consortium was founded, in

1982 the Rooms of the Community began to be structured; in 1983 the Vatican Television Center started up and in 1988 the Society for Religious Information was also set up.

In the years of John Paul II some documents and others that contain references important on social communication are published. One of these is the Encyclical Redemptoris Missio of 1990, whose theme is the "Missionary mandate of the Church". In the text, social communication is indicated as one of the areas of the ecclesial mission. At n. 37 we read: "The first areopagus of modern time is the world of communications, which is unifying humanity by making it - as they say - "a global village". The media is now a new space for the Church to evangelize.

John Paul II urged us not only to use the means in spreading the Gospel but also to insert the Gospel message into the "new culture" created by modern communication. He has repeatedly recalled that the positive development of the media at the service of the common good is a responsibility of each and every one. From one year to the next, his Messages for the World Communications Day have focused their attention on the different means of social communication, on public opinion, on how to promote peace, justice and personal freedom. A particular reference is made to the family, which lays the foundations of education and has the great responsibility to educate about media in order to understand its value, to have the conscience to select quality content, to become responsible and autonomous in using it. Another aspect on which the Pope invites us to reflect is the relationship of social communication with peace, culture and faith. The last document of John Paul II on this topic was his Apostolic Letter The Rapid Development of 2005. The document talks about the development of technologies in the media field as one of the "signs of progress" of today's society.

Benedict XVI surprised everyone by showing lot of interest and openness towards the media and in particular to social networks. It is during his Pontificate that Facebook and Twitter are invented, of which he opened his profile on 12 December 2012. A man of wide humanistic culture and a deep and discerning theologian, Benedict XVI very well understands the strength, development and incidence of digital culture on the lives of people and on the announcement of the Church. His Messages lead the Christian community to consider not only that new media can be used but also that it is urgent to enter into it with pastoral attention. In the 2011 Message, with the theme Truth, announcement and authenticity of life in the digital age, invites us to be present in the digital arena, in social networks, as witnesses and evangelizers. At the same time, it warns against the very serious risks that derive from the abuse of communication and reaffirms their potentiality, which marks the difference between today's generation and the previous ones.

On 24 April 2010, in the speech to the participants of the National Convention with the theme *Digital Testimony: Faces and languages in the cross media era*, promoted by the National Office of Social Communications of the Italian Episcopal Conference, he drew attention to the risk of the digital divide and the need for a communicative justice. Although his pontificate lasted a few years compared to the previous one of John Paul II, Benedict XVI left a profound and appropriate message for our days when new technologies are developing rapidly.

Pope Francis is a great communicator and seems to know very well the strategies of communication. Testified by simple and direct language, his gestures and his way of relating to people without barriers and without many intermediaries is a powerful tool of communication. His success on digital media is not occasional: it derives from knowledge of the nature of these instruments and he makes the media context a personal meeting place. In his Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* he urges us to be bold and creative in language and be aware of the influence of the media in the life of the people especially the young.

In his message of 2014, entitled *Communication to the service of an authentic culture of encounter*, the Pope pushes us to be present in digital networks bearing in mind two objectives: the search for an authentic encounter with the other and the search for truth through the questions about the authentic meaning of life.

Pope Francis indicates the risk of a distracting use of the media, of a disordered access to information which offers people an excess of answers to unsolicited questions, while it weakens the ability to ask questions about the authentic meaning of doing and living. He writes that if "The speed with which information is communicated exceeds our capacity for reflection and judgement, and this does not make for more balanced and proper forms of self-expression. [...] the communicative environment can disorient us".

The Messages of the World Communications Day invite us year after year not to be passive but rather to become active protagonists, "good Christians and honest citizens" of this time. Social communication is a pastoral commitment, because it involves us all, as communicators, to become critical and responsible for what and how we communicate.

Opportunities

The development of the means of social communication offers a great opportunity for our mission and facilitates the way we communicate. They are considered an important means for the new evangelization, for the proclamation of the

Gospel, to do what matters most, that is, the good of the other. In the Apostolic Letter Rapid Development, John Paul II affirms: "Communication permeates the essential dimensions of the Church, called to announce to everyone the happy message of salvation. This is why it assumes the opportunities offered by the tools of social communication as data paths providentially given by God in our day to increase communion and make the announcement more incisive.

The Church is aware of the responsibility entrusted to it to spread the salvific message of Jesus Christ through the means of communication, with the old and new technologies, today especially with Internet resources.

A source for Evangelization

The great mandate of the Lord to the Church is to evangelize, that is, to proclaim to the world the Gospel and the coming of the Kingdom of God and of his love. It is interesting to note this insistence on the means of social communication as means for evangelization. Paul VI in his Message of 1974 writes: "Evangelization is an integral part of the mission of the Church, sent by Christ into the world to preach the Gospel to every creature (Mk 16, 15). The Church carries out this duty above all in her liturgical life, but she is constrained to fulfill it also in all the ways and by all the means which are available to her to use as she abides among the people of each continent". The Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Nuntiandi underlines this importance for the journey of faith: "The first proclamation, catechesis or further study of the faith cannot do without these means". It is John Paul II who, in an attempt to give an answer to the new challenges, emphasizes that we could now speak of "new evangelization". Convinced of the precious usefulness of the means of communication, in his Message for the 35th World Communications Day he invited all Christians to go and "Preach the Gospel of Christfrom the housetops". In today's world, a forest of transmitters and antennae sending and receiving messages of every kind to and from the four corners of the earth almost always mark housetops. Thanks to the means of social communication that His message can be reached everywhere, even in the places where public preaching is prohibited.

With the coming of the Internet, considering the increasing powerful influence on people's lives and aware of their strength and their weakness, John Paul II invites us to pay attention to this new communication technology which, he expresses it in his message of 2002, with the theme "A new forum for proclaiming the Gospel".

Benedict XVI expressed this conviction very clearly: in the time of the so-called social networks, especially because of the spread of Facebook and Twitter, in the Message of 2009, he recognized that one of the ways that evangelization facilitates in this age of history is the use of the new media that technology has brought to the world, especially to this generation, which he calls "the digital generation", and which calls for the introduction of human and Christian values in the culture of this communicative and informative environment.

Pope Francis deepens this reasoning on communication in a more effective way. In his first Message of 2014, he introduced the concept of "proximity in networks", with a question: "Who is my neighbour in the digital world?" This is an evangelical question. The concept of communication we are talking about is not just about the techniques and technologies, but also especially about the people who communicate.

Therefore, the Church cannot distance itself from this new call for mission and for evangelization, because this is its fundamental vocation.



Village Touring to Christ the King Parish Sonapahar

r. Lini Fenylla Shabong and Sr. Jacinta Sanafelt privileged to be part of the team of ten Sisters from the three congregations, namely Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (FMA), Visitation Sisters of Don Bosco (VSDB) and the Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians (MSMHC) who spent their Chritmas evangelising mission in the different villages of Christ the King Parish, Sonapahar. The programme was systematically arranged by Fr. Raphael Maiong SDB, Assistant Parish Priest. The people were all aware of the visit of Sisters and waited eagerly for their presence. The Sisters reached the Parish on 16 December and on the following day in a group of two all left for their different destinations.

In the company of the Catechist, Mr. Francis Diengdoh, from 17 - 25 December 2018 Sr. Lini and Sr. Jacinta walked from one village to another. Despite the long distance they felt such joy and satisfaction. They visited the villages and families in the Nongkyndang

Sub-district of Sonapahar Parish. They covered five villages - Mawstieh, Mawkhumkha. Mawjij, Upper Nongkyndang and Nongkyndang. The nine days were spent in visiting families and teaching catechism for children, youth and the parents particularly helping them to prepare well for the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation. The

Catholic faithful were very few compared to other denominations, yet their thirst for God was very inspiring. For the catechism class they would sit many hours without any hesitation and would hang on every uttered word. During those days they visited more than hundreds families in all the five villages. The people were so simple, welcoming, and appreciative and had great faith in the prayers of the priests and religious.

On Christmas eve, the faithful from the nearby villages came to Nongkyndang village. From 6.30 in the evening they started with Holy Rosary, Christmas Novena and Confessions. Another striking thing was the Christmas concert and a moment of praise and worship before the Vigil Mass. On Christmas Day the celebration opened with morning prayer and one hour of Adoration where everyone got the chance to be prayed over by Father and the Sisters; people came with their pain, difficulties, sickness and with all their intentions some even with tears but after the prayer they felt relieved and reconciled with God and with one another. The Christmas Mass was then celebrated with great devotion and fervour. In the





evening all the ten Sisters came back to the Parish happily after having shared the joy of Christ to the people. During dinner Fr. Sebastian Tirkey SDB, Parish Priest addressed a vote of thanks to Fr. John Zosiama SDB, Vice Provincial and the Sisters who had come to help the Parish. In his goodnight talk, Fr. John appreciated Fr. Sebastian and Fr. Raphael for taking the initiative of involving the Salesian family in the endeavour and expressed gratitude to the Sisters for their availability and generosity. The following morning after the thanksgiving Mass all returned to their respective communities.

Come and See Programme

These three days of animation were packed with various sessions like Charism of the Institute, Impact of Media on Youth, Missionary Activities of the Institute and Hygiene Tips. Each day the Holy

Eucharist was given a center stage with various Priests as celebrants who spoke convincingly on the call to religious life. Sisters of the Team creatively animated the various prayer moments with the help of audio-visual presentation. Action songs, Activities and games formed the integral part of the programme through which the girls got to interact, share and participate actively in every bit of it. To inculcate love and devotion for the Sacred Heart of Jesus the girls were taken for a pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Sacred Heart of Jesus at Sacred Heart Theological College, Mawlai. Another interesting part of the programme was an interaction of the girls with the Novices at Bellefonte; during which the Novices acted on the life of Mother Mazzarello and gave a clear picture on the life and mission of the Institute. At the close of the programme the girls made a presentation on what they have learnt during the three days in the form of short skits based on the call from the Bible. If the programme was successful the team owe its gratitude to Sr. Teresa Kamsuan and the Sisters of the community who were very supportive and went out of their way to see to the minutest detail of everything. Thanks to the communities who have taken keen interest in preparing and sending the girls for the programme.


Seminar on "Drug Addiction is a Social and Family Disease"

The Youth Ministry of Salesian Sisters' Shillong Province in collaboration with Bombay Teen Challenge organized a one-day seminar on "Drug addiction is a Social and Family Disease" on 21 February 2019 at Mary our Help Training Center Bellefonte. A prayer moment seeking God's blessings opened the Sr. Elizabeth George; seminar and Provincial gave a message, which set the right tone for the day's proceedings. The Coordinator of Youth Ministry Sr. Helen Puweiñ welcomed the resource persons Mr. K. K. Devaraj South Asian Director Teen Challenge and Mr. Emmanuel Project Director Shillong Teen Challenge and all the participants including the Animators of all the Communities, Principals, Headmistresses, local Co-coordinators of the youth and all the young people of different Parishes belonging to Shillong Nongstoiñ Archdiocese, and Dioceses. The main aim of the seminar was to impart basic information about drug addiction along with the introduction of some techniques to help out the victims.

Mr. K K Devaraj presented the first session; he started with an introduction about "Teen Challenge" Organisation also emphasizing on the 3 Ps necessary for anything to happen i.e. Passion, People and Programme. He further showed a video clip that gives a global view of the witness; testimonies and functions of the organizations in different countries. An inspiring man himself a recovered addict Mr. Emmanuel presented the second session in which he had spoken with facts and research done stating the effects of drugs, providing a clear presentation of the current situation of drug addiction in Shillong. He also introduced a testimony of Mrs. Aiti Tongwah a mother of an addict who moved everyone to tears with a heart-whelming story of her son being an addict facing many tantrums in life but with the grace of God she found Teen



Challenge and her son is recovering. In the third session Mr. KK Devaraj with a great stamina briefed out the different programmes available in Teen Challenge, which was followed by the interaction round in which he responded to the different queries that the participants had. Concluding the program, Sr. Helen Puwein took over the interaction session to get the desired expectations and the target areas from the participants to initiate action. The most important approach which is practiced successfully by the Teen Challenge Organization was the Word of God and Prayers simultaneously with medication and physical activities for the Residential addict whereas for the Nonresidential a method called 'Free Living Programme" proved to be very effective. All the participants expressed the great desire to make a positive movement in reaching out to those who are caught up by this addiction as well as to prevent potential victims.

They also came up with a plan of having Income Generating Programmes assigned to every Centre. On the second day the group spent time in learning simple Photoshop tools for designing and flower making. At the close of the programme the Sisters had a brief evaluation and expressed their gratitude for the two days well spent in order to be effective in their mission field.

MEDIA matters...

Know Your Gadgets



Projectors are popular and effective presentation tools for classroom and business, church and community groups and for home entertainment use. Before you buy a projector, consider the intended use and audience size and learn about the types of projectors sold. This will help you to choose a projector that is right for your application.

The technology used in projectors can generally be broken down into two types: transmissive or reflective. Because LCD (liquid crystal display) projectors pass light through the LCD panels rather than bouncing it away, they are considered a transmissive medium. A DLP (digital light processing) projector uses mirrors to direct the light in an image, so it is considered to be reflective. The third type of projector discussed, an LED (light emitting diode) projector, is named for the light source, not the type of projection technology.



Types of Projectors

DLP projectors

DLP projectors require less maintenance than LCD projectors because they have a filter-free and sealed chip design, which means dust cannot settle on the chip and cause an image spot. They are effectively immune to colour decay. Furthermore, they are not subject to the misalignments that can occur in LCD projectors with a three-panel design, which require each panel to be in perfect position to combine the image at the proper angle. However, DLP projectors with slower colour wheels may give off a rainbow effect, which is when bright flashes of colour appear on the screen, like rainbows. Also, although the chip is sealed, other components are not, so dust can settle on the colour wheel and affect image quality. Another disadvantage may be the poor viewing range. Most DLP projectors are not readily compatible with zoom lenses or lens shift functions, which


means they are best suited to smaller environments.

LCD projectors

The technology in LCD projectors is more established and reliable than film projectors. However, they may still require maintenance, as pixels can burn out and dust particles can interfere with image quality. On the other hand, LCD projectors have no moving parts, as DLP projectors do, and they are generally less expensive than their DLP counterparts. They also support setups in larger rooms where a greater projection distance is needed, because they are compatible with zoom lenses and lens shifts. This makes them great for larger, at-home cinema projects, as long as there is a smooth projection surface available.

LED projectors

LED projectors are defined not by the display technology used, but the lighting. In fact, some DLP projectors with "solid-state illumination" technology are actually LED projectors. Another type of projector, the Pico projector, commonly uses LED technology as well. Pico projectors are essentially handheld devices that use LCoS, or liquid crystal on silicon, which is similar to an LCD panel but reflective



rather than transmissive. In these cases, the projector replaces the traditional lamp with longer-lasting and more efficient LEDs, coloured in red, green, and blue. In DLP projectors, this also replaces the colour wheel technology, instead letting the red, blue, and green LEDs shine directly on the DMD chip.

The LEDs in an LED projector have a much longer life than traditional projector lamps, rated at 10,000 or even 20,000 hours as opposed to 1,000 hours to 5,000 hours. As such, the LED light source is meant to last the entire life of the projector without ever needing to be replaced. This is a big advantage in multimedia setups because replacing traditional lamps can be a major expense in projector maintenance. There is no warm-up or cool-down time needed because the LEDs are much more energy-efficient than traditional light sources, and they are also much quieter. This reduces maintenance and operating costs.

Some of The Factors Used to Categorize and Evaluate Projectors

Resolution

Resolution is a major factor. Projectors for viewing videos in a large room or auditorium, for example, will require a higher resolution than projectors used for PowerPoint presentations in an office. You need to choose a projector with a high enough resolution for its most frequent use. A resolution of 800 x 600 DPI (dots per square inch) is generally adequate for basic PowerPoint presentations in an office or conference room. 1024 x 768 or higher allows for more detail and 1280 x 1024 and more for an even higher quality image.

Brightness and contrast

Brightness and contrast are important elements of image quality. Projector brightness is measured in lumens. Projector usage and surroundings determine the type and brightness of projector needed. When used in a small room projecting on a small screen, an LCD or one-chip DLP projector with a lumen rating of 1,500 to 6,000 may be used with appealing results. In large venues using larger screens or when ambient light may affect the image, a three-chip DLP projector with a lumen rating of 10,000 to 28,000 should be used. The higher the lumen value, the higher the potential brightness of the image.

Lenses

Different types of lenses are available. If the projector is to be placed close to the screen, a short-throw lens may be needed. If the projector will be in the back of a room or large arena far away from the screen, a long-throw lens may be necessary. Distance from the projector to the screen and screen size must both be taken into account

Lamps or Bulbs Life span

The lamps used in projectors have a limited life span. Just like any light bulb, projector bulbs have an expected operating time, called lamp life span. This value is expressed in hours and represents the number of hours before the lamp is at half its original brightness. Some projectors use special light bulbs to create light, while others use LCD or LED lamps that, like any light source, will eventually wear out and need to be replaced. Most bulbs or lamps will last for about 2,000 to 5,000 hours, though some projectors can be expected to last considerably longer and LED lamps last for about10,000 or even 20,000 hours.




