"Go wherever I send you" Are Jesus' words for you and me. Let our genuine response be "Lord I am here, now send me".


Those who follow the Lord, On the hard road have to trod. They're always on a journey, From inconveniences we will not flee.

A person with missionary spirit, The fire in one's heart is lit. Ready to do any sacrifice For love of God they do strive.





also includes the presentation of the Word of God, the Constitutions, the Institute flag and coat of arms. During the Prayer moment the two Novices who opted to be missionaries namely Marbel Pasi and Meldaris Sviemlieh were invited to carry the lamps symbolizing the light of Christ and being prayed over by Sr. Carmelina Sun, Provincial Councilor and Animator of Bellefonte Community. The ambient of the Morning Prayer infused a sense of profound gratitude to God for the gift of our first six missionaries. It created a thrill for each one to inculcate the same fervour for the Lord and the mission. Privileged enough, there was an opportunity to have the Holy Mass celebrated by Rev. Fr. V.V. Paul from Sacred Heart Theological College. In his homily he highlighted and complimented the works and apostolate of the Missionaries and appreciated the first sisters who dared to take the courageous step to leave their country at a very young age for the sake of the Gospel.

In the afternoon, our Community joined the Community of Bellefonte to mark the day. The hostellers from our Community gave a Choir piece entitled "In that Sweet Home" and the choreography from Hillsong entitled "God's great." The day was concluded with the animated Evening Prayer service in the community. It was an event of joy and celebration and at the same time an occasion that incited a missionary impulse in the heart of each Daughter of Mary Help of Christians, candidates and young people.

The community of Auxilium Convent, Umdang started the celebration of the conclusion of the 140th Anniversary of the First FMA Missionary Departure with a solemn animation of the Morning Prayer. The day was spent in thanksgiving to God for the gift of our first Missionaries. At 6:00 pm the community continued to thank God through the Holy Eucharistic celebration joined by a few representatives from the vouth, Salesian Cooperators, Sunday Catechism Children and the women of the Parish. # Missionary Mandate to the New Missionaries

On 24 September 2017, the Salesian family rejoiced and thanked God for the 36 new missionaries who courageously responded to

their missionary call; 22 SDBS and 14 FMAS. The celebration began with the solemn entrance procession led by the missionaries followed by the priests. Rector Major, Fr Ángel Fernández Artime was the main celebrant and concelebrated by numerous priests, supported by Mother General, Yvonne Reungoat and the presence of the young people of Pietmontese added grandeur to the celebration.

The Rector Major Fr. Ángel Fernández Artime reminded the gathering about the 140<sup>th</sup> First FMA Missionary Expedition, dated 14 November 1877 with Uruguay as the destination. He remarked that the missionary mandate of this year too was as beautiful and authentic as the first and subsequent ones by Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. During the homily, he added that the 148 consecutive expeditions that have never stopped, even in the years of the two world wars revealed the reality that is beyond the human. To the new missionaries, Fr Ángel F. Artime also wished to spotlight the missionary work of Fr. Tom Uzhunnalil, faithful to God and to his mission in Yemen, both in the time of his ordinary ministry and throughout the time and experience of his kidnapping. To the missionaries, the Rector Major underscored the importance of feeling summoned to share life with the very people they would be soon reaching, without the pretense of being there to teach, as experts; and he reiterated that the missionary dimension was, and remain, a fundamental option for the Congregation. "Without the missionaries, many of us would not be here," he said. Beautifully, accompanied by the prayer of all those present, he consigned the Missionary Cross





to the Salesian missionaries, while Mother Yvonne Reungoat did the same with the FMA missionaries. The missionaries were overwhelmed with joy and supported by their unfailing trust in God and the prayer of the faithful ready to set forth to the different parts of the world where they are sent to proclaim the Good News. It was indeed a meaningful and God experience celebration.



### Auxilium Lum Jingshai bags First Prize in Khasi Folk Dance



## Technology Teenagers

It can often seem like teenagers are using technology and the internet for a large part of the day. And it's hard to know where the line falls between safe, rewarding use and overuse of technology. This page can help you to find out more about how your child uses technology, whether they are using it responsibly, and when there might be a problem with how they are spending their time online.

#### How and why teenagers use technology

It sometimes seems like teenagers' lives revolve around their phones and technology. From the internet and social media, to phones, apps, games, television and other types of technology, it's easy to wonder whether it's all too much. Technology is increasingly becoming an essential part of our lives, and many young people – often referred to as 'digital natives' – haven't known it any other way.

Young people use the internet and social media to:

- connect with, comment on and discuss things with others, through social networking, emailing and online messaging
- find, create or share interesting photos, videos and articles
- join or follow interest groups
- play online games
- learn more about topics that interest them
- as a study tool for school.

#### Potential benefits for teenagers

Young people love going online, for very good reason. By using the internet, they can:

- access information to inform and educate themselves
- maintain and develop supportive relationships
- form their identities (through selfexpression, learning and talking)
- promote a sense of belonging and selfesteem through staying connected with friends and being involved in diverse communities.
- Research shows that the things that help young people have a positive experience online are:
- having a good understanding of the internet and how online media work (including things like privacy settings)
- having the skills to critically understand, analyse and create content that adds value for themselves and others.

If young people understand what it means to be a good 'digital citizen', you have every reason to trust them with managing their own internet use, just as you trust them to act responsibly when they're at school and out with friends.

#### Potential risks for teenagers

Potential risks online are closely related to issues young people can experience at school, at home and in the community. It's important to remember that, just as teenagers need to have good boundaries and rules for offline behaviour, and the guidance and morals to make good decisions, they also need these things to protect them when online.

Some risks associated with being online are:

• Cyberbullying: This is when people use

technology to embarrass, harass or bully someone. Cyberbullying can include posting mean or untrue statements, making fake online profiles intended to embarrass people, sharing embarrassing photos, and more.

- Trolling: This is when people deliberately try to start arguments or to upset people on the internet, often causing considerable distress.
- Isolation: Too much time spent online and using technology is time not spent face-to-face with family and friends, which can create barriers and contribute to a sense of isolation.
- Inappropriate material: Teenagers posting inappropriate pictures or content online, or sharing such material with friends, may humiliate themselves or others.
- Inappropriate relationships: Strangers or others may try to form inappropriate relationships with young people.

Being aware of these risks is the first step in helping your teenager to manage them.

### How much time are young people spending on screen-based activity?

A 2011–12 study by the Australian Bureau of Statistics indicated that young people aged from 5 to 17 years spend, on average, just over 2 hours per day on screen-based activity, compared to 1.5 hours per day on physical activity. Just under half of 2- to 17-year-olds had access to at least one type of screen (TV, computer, phone, etc.) in their bedrooms. For 15- to 17-year-olds, this figure goes up to 75 per cent.

More recent statistics on teenage internet use (2014–15) indicate that 15- to 17-year-olds:

• spend an average of 18 hours per week online (just over 2 hours per day)

• are most likely to use the internet for social networking (91 per cent), entertainment (73 per cent) and formal education activities (73 per cent).

### What is a healthy limit to set for my teenager?

Two hours used to be the golden rule for the amount of screen time young people should be allowed per day. That's now being revised because it just isn't realistic in the modern world where technology is used for education and social networking, as well as for entertainment. It's more important to set limits on recreational screen time, and to focus on the quality of what your children are doing on their devices.

Ask questions like:

- Where is my child looking for information? How do they know it's good quality?
- What kind of games and apps is my child using?
- Are they almost always using their screen time for distraction or procrastination?

These sorts of questions will help you find the line between healthy and unhealthy use of technology for your family.

#### It's all about balance

All of us, especially young people, need to learn how to exercise moderation in the things we spend time on. Having fun and staying connected to our friends and family is important. Some teenagers will do this by spending a lot of time connecting with their friends on social media, or by hanging out with other 'gamers' when playing multiplayer games online. That's okay!

But it's important to support them to balance that with face-to-face time with people, and to make sure they leave enough time in their week for physical exercise, learning, and other types of play.


On this occasion they felicitated the Silver Jubilarians and in particular to Sr. Liliana K. Marak for the realization of the


And so, he walked to the monk at the gates. "Eat and enjoy them," he said. "For you spend most of your time alone here, and these grapes will make you very happy."
