Each of us is personally responsible for its vitality. The charism is a gift of the Holy Spirit for the building up of the Church. It has an intrinsic prophetic dynamism and demands a continuous conversion for a progressive configuration to Jesus. This is the condition in order to be "generative" in the transmission of the charism that overwhelms and reaches multiple realities in a spiral movement, spreading in all contexts world-wide, a sign that what our founders have passed on to us retains an extraordinary relevance.

To prevent means having a perspective vision that allows us to identify the deepest needs people worldwide, young phenomena and dynamisms that move the society in order to perceive its evolving aspects and prophetic values. In a culture in which the very sources of life, of the person, of the family are threatened, the charism becomes ever more relevant.

In a world often divided and animated by the logic of competition, in contact with families marked by conflict and hardship, all of us can be a prophetic sign, an appeal to educational responsibility, a testimony of that project of communion to which every person is called, a support in times of difficulty.

We celebrate the joy of a presence: Mary is present and walks with us supporting us in the mission of educating young people. The expression of Don Bosco in his last meeting with the FMA in Nizza in 1885 does not concern only a house, a place, but indicates the presence of Mary in our life, in the communities, in the families, in your beautiful land.

The expression is not just an abstract phrase, but it indicates a vision and a certainty rooted in faith: it is Mary who has done everything and continues to do so, even today, here, we are sure of it!

To revive and to make the charism live, we need the capacity to look ahead with the awareness that what Don Bosco said is still valid today: "Being in many together increases joy, it serves as an encouragement to endure fatigue ... one communicates to the other their knowledge, their ideas and so one learns from the other. The being of many who do good animates us without realizing it". (Don Bosco in MB VII 602)

We are many of us, we ask through the intercession of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, to help us share the educational mission with passion and to know how to generously spend our resources, creating a network among ourselves and with those interested in the education and salvation of young people.

With this in mind, we hope to continue the journey, with the same fervour, for another 100 years, without limiting the Providence!

St. Mary's School, Ghatgre -A new mission of the Province

West Garo Hills of Meghalaya, a Don Bosco institution of the Guwahati Province was handed over to the Salesian Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Shillong Province on 18 March 2022. The official handing over was held in a function in the school campus where both the parties were present. The Salesian Provincial, Fr. Januarius S. Sangma represented the





Guwahati Province and Sr. Elizabeth George, Provincial represented the FMA Shillong Province.

The two Sisters, Sr. Deimon Dhar and Sr. Amalia Sangma were entrusted with the mission of looking after the school under the aegis of St. Mary Mazzarello Convent, Garobadha. In a simple yet grand function, which came as a surprise to the representatives of the Province as it was just an Salesian appointment with the Provincial Fr. Januarius, the Sisters were warmly welcomed with a traditional scarf and a bouquet of flowers. On this day the students performed their items exceedingly well in the form of dances and songs. IV National Youth Conference held in Gujarat

Youth Lady Animator (DYLA) of Nongstoin diocese led a representive of young people and attended the IV National Youth Conference at the



Pastoral Centre, Nadiad Ahmedabad Gujarat from 26 April – 1 May 2022. This national event is the first face to face meeting since the time of the pandemic and saw over 450 youth leaders from around the country. The North East Region was represented by 56 delegates from Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh. The delegation was led by Fr. John Barman MSFS and Youth Directors from different dioceses of the region.

The five-day event had nine group sessions in which each participant shared his or her experience, views and opinions on the theme 'Youth for the Synodal Church'. There were also workshops based on topics concerning the youth of today.

Youth from the 14 regions of the country presented their cultures through the form of music, art and dance. The Northeast delegation presented a fusion dance show consisting of the cultures of six states from the region. The colourful cultural show received appreciation from all the delegates.


who does not ask you to do so, but live in such a way that sooner or later he will ask you about him". The participants were warmly welcomed with a remix of English and Kokborok welcome song by the boarders and the Sisters in turn sang a Khasi song for them.

On 16 May, the day of their arrival, Sr. Elizabeth George, provincial gave an online message to the gathering where she highlighted the missionary identity of the Institute citing Articles 1 and 75 of the Constitutions. She further urged the Sisters to keep alive the missionary impulse and enthusiasm of the Institute and reminded them of the primacy of God experience in their personal life: listening to the Word and remaining at the feet of Jesus. During the three-day meeting the Sisters had sessions on "Tips for the Touring Sisters" taken by Sr. Maristella Ryngkhlem, "Report Writing" by Sr. Celina Maslai and "Tips for successful Apostolate" by Fr. Sunny Joseph SDB. Apart from the sessions, the senior Sisters with many years of experience in the field of evangelization shared with the group the best practices, which made them effective in their ministry. The Sisters also had some brainstorming in order to come up with future plans and activities to be incorporated in the Annual Plan of the province for the year 2023. The Sisters expressed their contentment of having had such program as it gave them a platform to express their views, share their problems and also discuss the future plans in order to facilitate the ministry in the field of mission

and evangelization. As part of the field experience the Sisters were opportune to visit the centres of the SDB and FMA mission in Tripura: SDB Pre-Novitiate Herma, Auxilium Bishramganj, St. Xavier's School Pathaliaghat, Don Bosco Nandan Nagar, Mariamnagar Parish, Auxilium Mandwi and Mandwi Parish. Furthermore, through a series

of nineteen exercises the Sisters have delved into self-introspection, which into self-discovery. resulted group work and sharing was another platform in which the Sisters could freely share their thoughts, opinions, ideas and experiences, a healing balm in itself. The participants have come to realize that they all go through similar experiences though the intensity varies from one individual to the other. The pictorial display of thoughts from renowned psychologists made another impact on the Sisters where one could identify their feelings and find meaning in being a woman.

The last session of the seminar was a going back memory lane in which the Sisters in profession batches shared some of the nostalgic memories of their formation years which brought much joy, laughter and tons of sisterly feeling towards one another. Each Sister has taken up the journey forward in one's personal life in order to live life to the full as they fulfill the mission entrusted to them in their respective communities.

Marking this beautiful event 16 Sisters made their Perpetual Profession offering their life as permanent members of the Institute. The Eucharistic celebration on this twin celebration was presided over by Most Rev. Victor Lyngdoh DD, Archbishop of Shillong and concelebrated by more than thirty

priests among whom was the Salesian Provincial of Shillong Province, Fr. Paul Olphindro Lyngkot.



HOW TO IDENTIFY FAKE NEWS

You may be wondering how to identify fake news on Facebook and other social media sites? How to avoid fake news? Or how to avoid accidentally sharing misinformation online? Here are ten tips to identify misinformation, recognize fake news websites, and think before you share:

1. Check the source:

Check the web address for the page you're looking at. Sometimes, fake news sites may have spelling errors in the URL or use less conventional domain extensions such as ".infonet" or ".offer". If you are unfamiliar with the site, look in the About Us section.

2. Check the author:

Research them to see if they are credible – for example, are they real, do they have a good reputation, are they writing about their specific area of expertise, and do they have a particular agenda? Consider what the writer's motivation might be.

3. Check other sources:

Are other reputable news or media outlets reporting on the story? Are credible sources cited within the story? Professional global news agencies have editorial guidelines and extensive resources for fact-checking, so if they are also reporting the story, that's a good sign.

4. Maintain a critical mindset:

A lot of fake news is cleverly written to provoke strong emotional reactions such as fear or anger. Maintain a critical mindset by asking yourself – why has this story been written? Is it promoting a particular cause or agenda? Is it trying to make me click through to another website?

5. Check the facts:

Credible news stories will include plenty of facts – data, statistics, quotes from experts, and so on. If these are missing, question why. Reports with false information often contain incorrect dates or altered timelines, so it's a good idea to check when the article was published. Is it a current or old news story?

6. Check the comments:

Even if the article or video is legitimate, the comments below may not be. Often links or comments posted in response to content can be autogenerated by bots or people hired to put out misleading or confusing information

7. Check your own biases:

We all have biases – could these be influencing the way you respond to the article? Social media can create echo chambers by suggesting stories that match your existing browsing habits, interests, and opinions. The more we read from diverse sources and perspectives, the more likely it is that we can draw accurate conclusions.

8. Check whether it's a joke:

Satirical websites are popular, and sometimes it is not always clear whether a story is just a joke or parody. Check the website to see if it's known for satire or creating funny stories.

9. Check if images are authentic:

Images you see on social media couldhave been edited or manipulated. Possible signs include warping – where straight lines in the background now appear wavy – as well as strange shadows, jagged edges, or skin tone that looks too perfect. Bear in mind, too, that an image may be accurate but simply used in a misleading context. You can use tools such as Google's Reverse Image Search to check where an image originates from and whether it has been altered.

10. Use a fact-checking site:

the anthem of the Cooperators "We are the Salesian Cooperators" followed by a group photo and a sumptuous breakfast sponsored by some members and prepared by the community.



Online Formative Meet of the Youth Animators (INS)


