My dear Sisters,

Loving greetings from Auxilium Provincial House, Nongthymmai!

We are at the threshold of a new month that brings us new showers of blessings and opportunities for growth in the mission and in holiness. We embrace the new month with the celebration of the World Day of Consecrated Life which reminds us of God's profound love for us. The Church dedicates this celebration in a particular way to consecrated people, to underline their particular vocation and mission. In reality, the event of Jesus' life reminds us of the presentation of man to the Lord, in the sense that every man and every woman is called to live consecration to the Lord.

Consecrated people are called all the more to give credible witness to consecrated life with their lifestyle and to testify that it is possible to live in chastity of thoughts and actions and to live dependent on God's Providence; that it is possible to live fully free even in obedience to the will of God and to be the witnesses of Holiness. At the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, it is Jesus who presents himself to his people as the Light that brings salvation to the earth. Where the Lord is, in fact, there is salvation, that is, life, joy and hope. Simeon and Anna welcomed the presence of God and they were full of joy. This gesture is a sign for all baptized and consecrated Christians of the need to welcome the Lord in their hearts and lives who will then transform us into new creatures and bearers of joy and hope to the world.



Let us remember when the Lord called us to follow him, he calls us to stand by him, to walk in his ways, to imitate his life and to welcome his Word as a light for our journey. He has placed us in the Church and in the world, not just in our communities. The alliance with the Lord makes us a people, not realities closed in on ourselves but that becomes a gift to the world. Today, consecrated men and women are expected to be persons of prayer, of listening to the Word of God, of sacramental life, of

hope because we know that God does not break His promises but the time has come to be together and become prophets of Hope to the world. By our lifestyle, we testify to the world that it is possible to live in chastity of thoughts and actions; that it is possible to live dependent on the Providence of God, who, as he takes care of the birds of the sky and the lilies of the field, so, even more, takes care of every person created in his image; that it is possible to live fully free while still obedient to the will of God, expressed by the rule and exhortations of our Holy Constitutions. Ultimately, we can say that Religious are the witnesses of possible Holiness. Our mission is to demonstrate true and real the statement of the archangel Gabriel to Mary: "nothing is impossible with God" (Lk 1, 37).

As we reflect on the significance of Consecrated life, let us pray that the Lord may continue to guide and bless us in our whole lives, in everything that we say and do, so that by our exemplary lives and actions, we will always continue to grow ever stronger in faith, and continue to love Him at all times, remembering always how He has loved us so much, that He gave us all the perfect gift in His Son, Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, through whom all of us have received the assurance of eternal life and true happiness and joy with God.

Our Lady of Lourdes and 32nd World Day of the sick

The feast of the Virgin of Lourdes was chosen because many pilgrims and visitors to Lourdes have reported being healed through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin. Pope John Paul II, who had written extensively on the topic of suffering, believed that suffering was much more than a salvific and redemptive process through Christ. He indicated in his apostolic letter "Salvifici Doloris" that suffering can be an opportunity to join the suffering of Christ and find meaning and hope in the midst of difficulties. On February 11, 1858, Mary manifested herself as "the Immaculate" to Bernadette Soubirous in the grotto of Massabielle, no less than 18 times until 16 July. This event means that we can well count the spiritual and privileged sign of God who chose this young and special messenger to announce the mysteries of the Kingdom of God. Bernadette is the apostle of the message of Lourdes which we can summarize in the canticle: *I bless you, Father because you revealed to the little ones the mysteries of your love.* As our Blessed Mother appeared to little Bernadette, she does appear to us too in different ways and through various persons and situations in life. The Church invites us to celebrate this day as an opportunity to draw the attention of society to those who fight against a disease every day or is committed to finding ways to live with it peacefully by our expression of affection and solidarity.

It is not good that
man should be alone

This year the Holy Father has invited the Church to celebrate this day reflecting on the theme: “It is not good that man should be alone.” Pope Francis recalls the model of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:25-37) with his “ability to slow down and draw near to another person, to the tender love with which he cares for the wounds of a suffering brother” and reminds us that “the first form of care needed in any illness is compassionate and loving closeness. To care for the sick thus means above all to care for their relationships, all of them: with God, with others – family members, friends, healthcare workers –, with creation and with themselves.” While we pray through the intercession of our Blessed Mother for all the sick people of the world and resolve to care and love them in their human dignity, we pray that we may grow in the art of loving and caring for one another and build up a healthier and more conducive environment of interpersonal relationships, love and solidarity with all. As we celebrate this day in communion with the Church, let us keep a special remembrance of all the sick people and those who care for them and let us remind ourselves that we have the duty of reaching out to the sick and weak ones with a heart open like that of the good Samaritan, that looks at them with compassion, embraces them with closeness and takes care of them with love and tenderness.
