My dear Sisters,

Loving greetings from Auxilium Provincial House, Nongthymmai!

We are beginning a new month that reminds us of God's unconditional love and our generous response to it. This significant month dedicated to St. Joseph invites us to a radical 'YES' that become our response to God's invitation in his plan of salvation as did our great and exemplary Saint even amidst doubts and adversities of life. This month gives us ample opportunities to look up to this great model of 'FIAT,' to continuously strive to adhere to God's holy will and to make incessant efforts to fulfill it in our lives. Adherence to God's will is the secret to being happy on earth which we need very much for serenity in our hearts. To arrive at this goal, our journey here on earth must arise from an intense interior life and be placed in the perspective of holiness that consists of an intense and intimate relationship with God, source of life and joy: This is the will of God: our sanctification (cf. 1 Thess.4,3). Let us draw inspiration from St. Joseph in this art of surrendering ourselves to God's holy will.

Joseph was a just and obedient man. The Gospel does not directly attribute any words to him, but his silence and every circumstance in which he is spoken of, have an enormous specific weight. Saint Joseph, as the father of Jesus and husband of Mary, is defined, precisely because of his faith, with the sober and magnificent title of righteous man, because he is available to faithfully obey the Will of God. He lovingly incorporated the divine plans of God that we could see in him the totality of being immersed in God's grace and able to transform his life into a symphonic blending of Faith, Hope and Charity.

Joseph, man of faith. Joseph gives himself entirely to the plan designed by God for him. He was first and foremost a man of Faith because he was able to see beyond, he was able to see things in a new way: In that mystery that was taking place in the womb of the Virgin Mary he saw not simply a child, but the son of God made man for our salvation. Saint Joseph was able to see in the folds of his history a greater project: to become the guardian of the Redeemer, and for this reason he put aside his personal project. Saint Joseph teaches us that the initiative of spiritual life is always God's. The Lord intervenes, but requires our faith, from whom he asks humble abandonment to Him. Only in this way can God operate, because faith leaves room for divine action. Faith, in fact, requires humble and total abandonment which involves relying solely on the Word of God. In faith, on the one hand, we allow God to be God and, on the other hand, we allow Him to work in us. Faith allows

us to enter the mystery of God and live in full communion with Him. St. Joseph becomes for us an example to remain steadfast in the gift of Faith we received on the day of our baptism and to look beyond the contingencies of our everyday life to be able to see and experience the constant presence of God.

Joseph, man of hope. Hoping means entrusting oneself to God, trusting God, placing ourselves in his hands. Saint Joseph was a man of Hope, because even in the most difficult and incomprehensible moments, he entrusted himself and trusted in God. Let us think for a moment about the moment in which Saint Joseph had to wake up the Virgin Mary at night and with the baby Jesus and had to flee to Egypt, without any security, without any certainty, with who knows how many fears and thoughts would have captured him. Yet in that moment Saint Joseph trusted and entrusted himself to God. We too, in the dramatic moments of our lives, are called not to be dismayed, but to entrust ourselves to the Lord who will lead us as he had Saint Joseph.

Joseph, man of charity. Joseph performed heroic gestures and actions in the hiddenness of his life and in the house of Nazareth- his faithfulness in everyday life, his concern for his family, his total sense of respect, his love for Mary and Jesus. He is termed as a man of great charity. For him, charity consisted in giving oneself to God, in welcoming his divine plan, in guarding, loving, protecting, the most precious gifts of the Almighty: his son Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary.



We know well that there was nothing extraordinary about St. Jospeh. We can think of him as an ordinary man, overwhelmed by an event bigger than himself. His greatness lies in having experienced the events in which he was involved, with faith, hope and love, managing to 'give family' to the eternal Word of God, made flesh. For this reason, he was proclaimed patron of the universal Church. Let us invoke him as our sure patron and intercessor and our traveling companion in our journey of life especially as we continue to live intensely our Lenten journey. May he help us become men and women of faith, hope and charity capable of building communion with the mystery of God's infinite love.

One with Christ in the Holy Week

Celebrating the various events of the Holy week which will occur during this month reminds us that we are called to become one with Christ, to share in his agony, passion and death and to express concretely our act of discipleship by our way of life not just in word and thoughts but more explicitly by our deeds and examples. The liturgy of the Holy Week reminds us of our vocation to be a new creature in Christ. It does not close in on itself, but opens up to life. Holy Week, with its rich symbolism, helps us to enter into a more intimate relationship with Christ, but to change our lives and to live - at least a little more - just as he lived. The events that the Church celebrates every year in Holy Week are not just events of history nor ones to be admired, but they are to be imitated and in which to be involved along with Jesus who is not a hero to be exalted but a 'living' and 'contemporary' model to be followed. Celebrating the rites of Holy Week does not mean admiring the gestures and words of Jesus from a distance, but being involved in his story, in the awareness that it still has something to say concretely to us today, because the passion, death and resurrection of Christ is still a 'salvific' event today. The Holy Week, through the liturgy made up of symbols, gestures and the Word of God, makes present the salvific mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ. This is not enough, however, if on our part there is not a heart open and available to encounter the Lord. It is necessary to enter these holy days with the availability of those who want to let themselves be met by Jesus and the grace that he wants to give us.



The celebration of the Paschal Mystery of Christ therefore, should stir our lives to make us feel involved in the salvific events of Jesus in order that we could all be a little Simon, a little Joseph of Arimathea, a little Nicodemus, a little one of the Marys and have a 'direct' experience of the encounter with the One who 'loved us to the end!' With this spirit let us 'read' the events of the 'Great and Holy Week', in which the Love of God surpasses our human miseries. 'Holy Week' should not be considered as the final week of Lent but, as one author writes, "we would like to define it as the first week of our belief in Jesus, the son of God, who came to earth to be the new Light of the entire world."

Preparation for World Day of Gratitude

The Vicar General of our Institute Sr. María del Rosario García Ribas has communicated that the World Feast of Gratitude 2024 will be held at Mozambique with the theme:

With Mary, guided by the ''dream'', we generate peace by taking care of our Common Home.

Quoting the words of Sr. Maria del Rosario "in the context of Integral Ecology, the celebration of the World Feast of Gratitude is intended to be a hymn of praise. [...] We are invited to open our eyes and contemplate in the book of nature, the majesty of the Lord our God. What else can one do in front of such a marvelous manifestation, if not to let oneself be enraptured and sing? The sky, the sea, the earth, the stars, the flowers, man whom God has made "little less than the angels," speak to us of the very Author who created us."



The logo of the Feast, through some significant elements, recalls Mary, the prototype of caring, who embraces the world, the common home; the different faces of the young people of the five continents, that express the educational mission given to Johnny Bosco in the dream at nine years; the baobab, sacred tree, symbolizing life, powerful symbol of Africa that seems to unite heaven and earth, and which provides the people with nourishment and remedies for various ailments; the colors of the flag of Mozambique that represent the country with its riches, its history, and its commitment to peace.
